## DPL-10751 Cantharellus texensis Buyck & Hofstetter

Pileus 15-40 mm broad, becoming deeply depressed, moist, fibrillose-scaly at disk, less so to margin, cinnabar color; context odor pleasant, taste slightly peppery, white; lamellae deeply decurrent, almost close, 1 mm broad, forking and intervenose,  $\pm$  concolor pileus; stipe 3.5-4 cm long, 3-6 mm broad,  $\pm$  equal, moist to dry, glabrous, solid, concolor pileus; spore print white; Basidiospores elliptical, granular, 8-9.5 x 4-4.5  $\mu$ m; Cuticle with thickened walls.

Habit and habitat. Abundant in a mixed pine and hardwood forest.

Lat. exact GPS N 30° 15.901′, Long. 94° 30.759′, elevation around 35′

Comments. This site is most likely the holotype site for C. texensis as Bart Buyck and I collected in this area in July 2007; digital image.
