*Cantharellus lateritius* (Berk.) Singer

Pileus 3-6 cm broad and larger, convex-depressed, margins drooping, more uplifting and funnellform with age, moist to dry, glabrous to eroded, yellow-orange; context 1-4 mm thick, odor fruity, taste mild, off white to pale yellowish; lamellae decurrent, close, narrow to almost smooth with blunt edges, forking with cross veination, vary variable, yellow; stipe 3.5-5 cm long, 7-15 mm broad, slightly tapered to base, moist to dry, glabrous, solid to hollow, slightly lighter than cap.

Habit and habitat. Gregarious, abundant in stream bottomland hardwood forest.

Lat. general GPS 30° 42.509' N, Long. 93° 49.630' W
