Cantharellus tenuithrix Buyck & V. Hofstetter

PILEUS 3-5 cm broad, plane with a slight depression, more depressed with age, dry, glabrous, margin even, in rolled, becoming more wavy with age, orangish yellow; CONTEXT 5 mm thick, odor and taste mild; LAMELLAE decurrent, almost close, 0.5 mm broad, acute to blunt, more forking, midway and to margin, pale yellowish nearer stipe, more yellow to margin, yellow in age; STIPE 3.5-5 cm long, 10-12 mm broad, \pm equal, moist, glabrous, solid, white and parts bruising yellowish; SPORE PRINT pale cream; SPORES not studied; CUTICLE not studied; CYSTIDIA not studied.

HABIT AND HABITAT. Gregarious with white oak and other hardwoods, some pines nearby.
